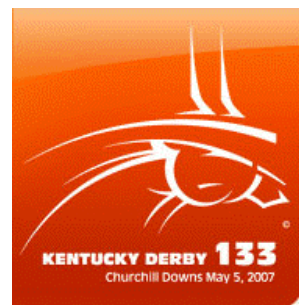

DERBY DAY TRIFECTA AT HARRAH'S CHESTER

On Kentucky Derby Day, May 5th Harrah's Chester Casino & Race-track will be action packed with a full day and night of excitement. A trifecta of fun, starting with the Kentucky Derby, Cinco de Mayo and ending with the De La Hoya vs. Mayweather fight will take place.



The Kentucky Derby will be shown in the comfort of the exciting new Riverview Terrace from noon to six p.m. Reserved table seating available, with simulcast action. A free Derby Day Seminar will be given by Craig Donnelly, *Philadelphia Inquirer's* Turf writer and Handicapper. Donnelly, whose race picks have been a staple of the *Inquirer* for more than 30 years, is recognized as one the nation's best public handicappers. He will present his expert opinion and an overview of the Derby field so that everyone--from newcomer to veteran handicapper alike--can obtain useful information that might help them pick the Derby winner. Mike Tanner, Harrah's Chester Director of Racing Operations will also be available to answer questions from the audience. Everyone in the audience will have the chance to win a free fifty dollar Kentucky Derby win wager on the horse of their choice.



Harrah's asks Derby Day fans to dress as if they were at the Derby. Dinner for two at the Cove is up for grabs for the people who come down with the most colorful and creative hats. The Hat Contest will take place at 4pm next to the Player Services area on the 2nd floor, simulcast level.

Cinco de Mayo will be celebrated at Harrah's with food specials available from noon until 7 p.m. in the EndZone Sport Bar & Grill. Guests can also watch the De La Hoya vs. Mayweather Fight in the EndZone Sport Bar & Grill from 8 p.m. to 1 a.m. on two 10 foot projectors and sixteen televisions.

Hundreds of race fans are expected to enjoy Michael's classic Mint Julep recipe at the feature bar "Fling" on Saturday afternoon, as the racetrack and casino offer not only Mint Juleps, but also the ability to watch and wager on the world-renowned Louisville classic.

"I really look forward to the challenge," Zywica said. "We expect hundreds of casino and race fans on Friday and Saturday at Fling, all wanting to have one of my Mint Juleps, and perhaps place a bet on the Kentucky Derby. "I am going to have to study my racing form." Zywica added. "Because I know that with every Mint Julep I serve, someone is going to ask me who I like in the race. I won't be telling anyone my secret ingredient for my Mint Juleps, but I don't have a problem helping them pick a horse in the big race."



Horseracing and casino patrons also can make advance wagers on the Kentucky Derby starting Friday, May 4, at 1:00 p.m. There will also be free past performance pages given out for the Derby field.
